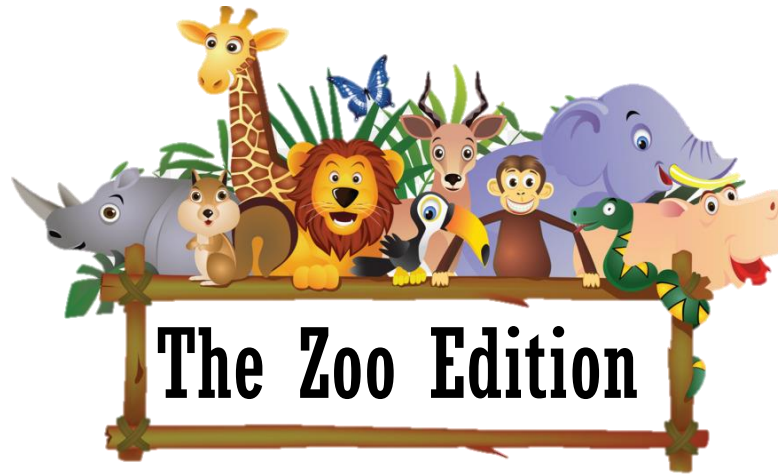




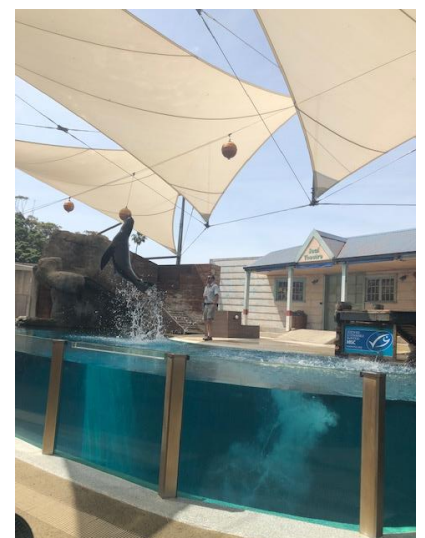
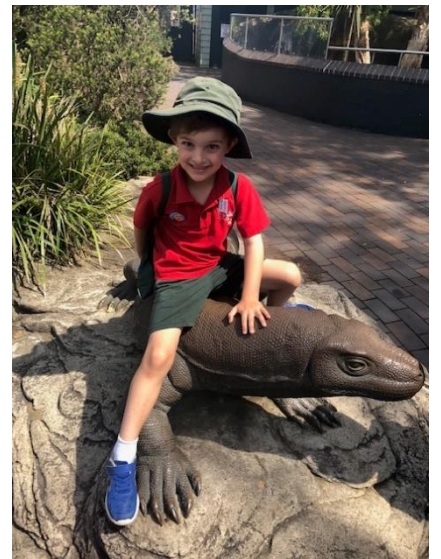
# KINDERGARTEN

Then it was time for lunch. We found a nice grassy patch overlooking the harbour where there were lots of sail boats out and about for the day,







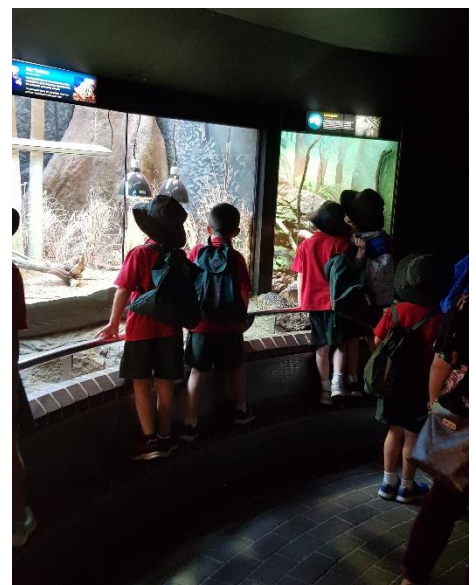
